

## **EOF Transfer Student Application Guidelines**

As you are aware, the Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) Program mandated by New Jersey Legislation sets forth student eligibility guidelines. Due to funding constraints, transfer students are not guaranteed funding. In order to be considered for funding, potential transfer students must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Student must be an EOF grant recipient from sending institution;
- 2. Student must be registered full-time (12 or more credits) for the semester and;
- 3. Student must meet the financial criteria set by the state of New Jersey.

As a potential EOF transfer student at Rutgers University-Newark, you must complete and submit the following documents to Dean Rose Bailey-Byers, in Bradley Hall, Room 103:

- 1. EOF Transfer Student Application and;
- 2. A letter from the EOF Director/EOF Counselor certifying that you are an EOF recipient from your sending institution\*.

Both documents must be submitted to Rose Bailey Byers <u>simultaneously</u> for your application to be considered. Transfers will be admitted on first-come, first-served basis.

EOF funding is limited and contingent upon your compliance with the EOF policies listed below.

You will be notified by letter regarding the status of your EOF Transfer Application within six to eight weeks of the start of the semester.

Transfer applications will not be accepted after the following dates:

## EOF TRANSFER POLICY

Once admitted into the EOF Program, EOF Transfer Students must adhere to the following policies:

1. Admitted EOF transfers are required to attend 2 mandatory workshops during the semester. The EOF Program will rescind EOF funds and admission into the EOF Program for non-compliance.

- 2. EOF students must meet with their assigned EOF Counselor based on the following criteria:
  - a) Probation students (GPA is below 2.00) must see their counselor every two weeks.
  - b) Students whose GPA is between 2.00 and 2.39 must see their counselor three times throughout the semester.
  - c) Students whose GPA is 2.40 and above must see their counselor twice a semester.
  - d) <u>Students who have not earned a GPA (transfers and freshmen) must see their counselor twice a semester.</u>
