

The Governor's Urban Scholarship Program, launched by New Jersey Governor Chris Christie in 2012, is a merit-based scholarship program that benefits students in New Jersey's economical challenged communities.

Eligibility Requirements

Students must:

- Rank within the top five (5.0) percent of their class at the end of their junior year and have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher at the end of the junior year of high school
- Reside in one of the designated communities
- Be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen
- Be a permanent New Jersey resident for at least 12 consecutive months immediately prior to enrollment
- Be registered with Selective Service Registration (if required)
- Be enrolled full-time in an approved degree or certificate program
- Attend an approved New Jersey college, university or degree-granting proprietary school
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress to qualify for renewal
- Complete a FAFSA each year within established deadlines and meet all program requirements including a New Jersey Eligibility Index (NJEI) below 10500Selective Service Act.

How Do I Apply

Candidates are selected for consideration by their high school based upon standard academic criteria in the fall of their senior year in high school. Award recipients are notified of their potential eligibility in December of their senior year in high school. Interested students should contact their high school guidance counselor for more information.

Enrollment Requirements

To receive this award, students must enroll full time in an approved degree or certificate program during the 2012-13 academic year at an eligible New Jersey college or university listed on the reverse.

Award Payment/Funding

The Governor's Urban Scholarship award eligibility will be reflected on the Student Eligibility Notice (SEN) each year.

Payment of one half of the total annual award will be made directly to the eligible institution by HESAA each semester after the start of classes.

As with all New Jersey publicly-supported student assistance programs, the award is dependent on annual State appropriations.

Renewal of Award

Students must complete a FAFSA each year within established deadlines and meet all program requirements including a New Jersey Eligibility Index (NJEI) below 10500. The Governor's Urban Scholarship award eligibility will be reflected on the Student Eligibility Notice (SEN) after the student's FAFSA is completed.
