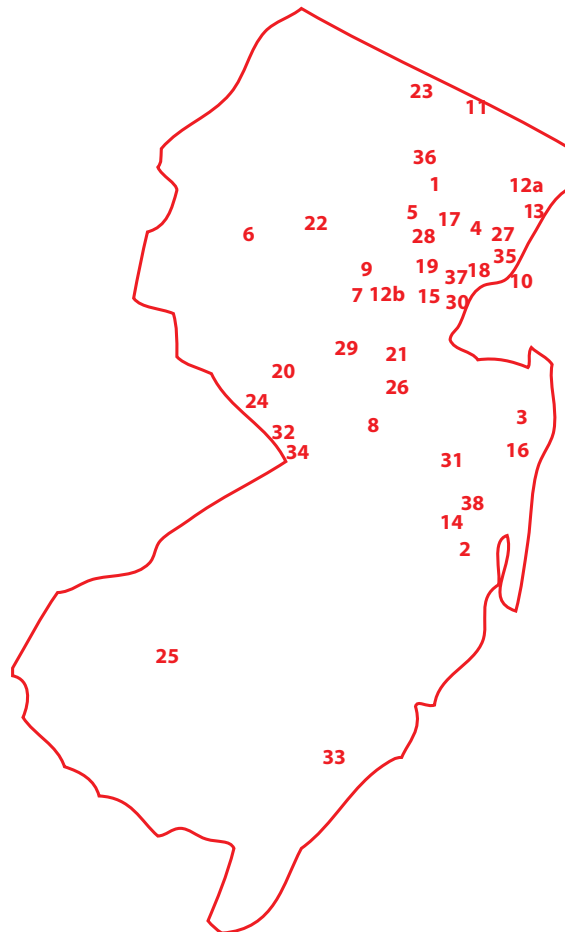

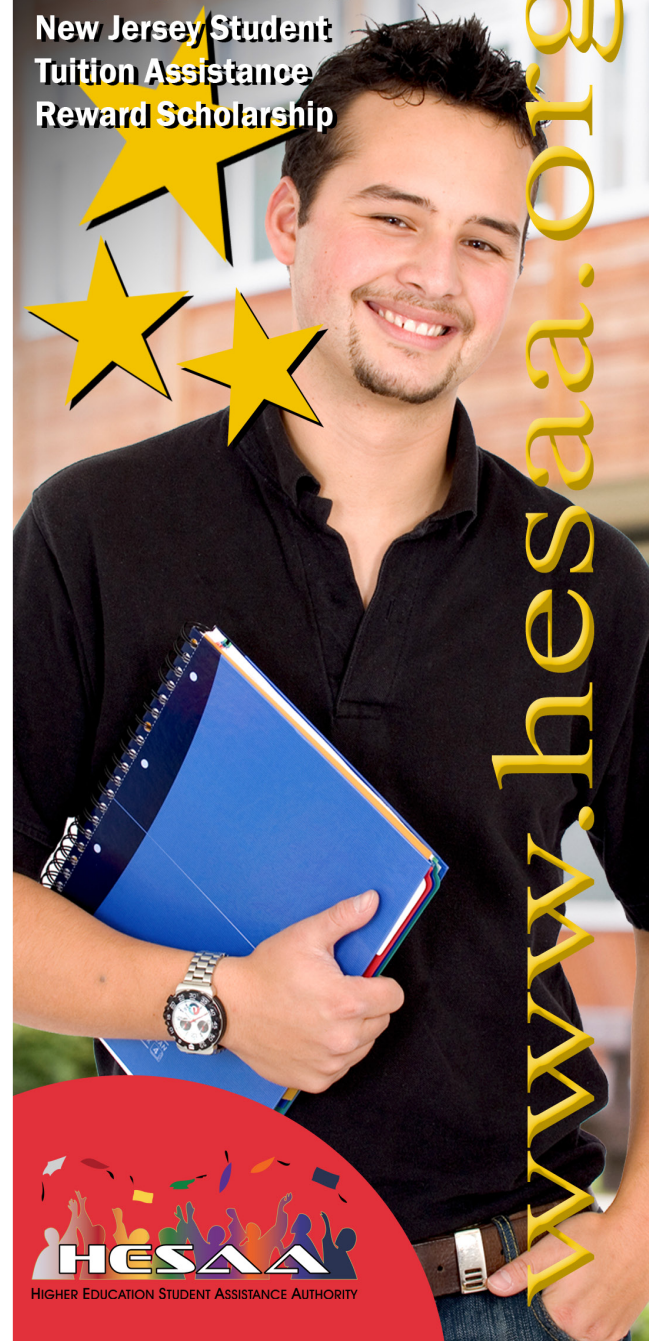

NJ STARS

NJ STARS II provides funding for successful NJ STARS scholars who transfer to a New Jersey four-year public or private college or university to earn a bachelor's degree.



Eligibility

Successful NJ STARS scholars may receive up to \$2,500 annually in NJ STARS II funding to earn a bachelor's degree at a New Jersey four-year public or private college or university that participates in the TAG program.

- Enrolls in a full-time course of study (minimum 12 college-level credits) each semester.
- Files a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and submits all required information within established State deadlines.
- Maintains continuous full-time enrollment, unless on a medical, family emergency or military leave approved by the institution.
- Has a household income of less than \$250,000.

Benefits

- The NJ STARS II award will be based on tuition only, except for Tuition Aid Grant recipients who will receive NJ STARS II awards based on tuition and approved fees. The amount of the NJ STARS II award will be determined after all other State and Federal grants and scholarships are applied to these charges, not to exceed \$1,250 per semester.
- May receive payment for up to four consecutive semesters, excluding summer sessions.

How Do I Apply?

- Apply for admission to one of the colleges or universities listed on the back of this brochure.
- Once admitted, inform the Admissions Office that you are a current NJ STARS scholar.
- Provide an official New Jersey county college transcript that reflects receipt of an associate degree and cumulative GPA of 3.25 or higher.
- File a FAFSA annually by the State deadline listed on the application.
- Meet all eligibility requirements.

Notification of your NJ STARS II eligibility will be provided by your New Jersey four-year public or private college or university.

PLEASE NOTE: NJ STARS eligibility does not guarantee admission to a NJ four-year public or private college or university.
